Manse Cat Monthly: Musings from Pastor Leia / her cat

On Pentecost Sunday, as we went out in peace to love and serve God and our neighbors, I closed our service with a scenario to act on: the Holy Spirit soared through our sanctuary and in Her enthusiasm, She knocked over the candles on the table, which were still lit at the time. "Let the fire of the Holy Spirit burn in your hearts," I implored, "but please exit as quickly and safely as you can through the nearest accessible exit: either down two steps and through the columbarium chapel, or out the back and down the ramp to the parking lot. We'll take a headcount outside and then share fellowship as usual."

I am assured that our sanctuary is very unlikely to catch on fire, but regardless, the flames of the Holy Spirit inspired me to call for a fire drill Pentecost morning. Remembering that the original structure of our church burned down in 1951, I think that it's important to occasionally refresh ourselves on our emergency preparedness. Have you ever been a part of a fire drill at a church before? Have you ever taken note of where our fire extinguishers are located? Do you know which exit is the most accessible from where you usually sit? Remember that the most accessible exit might not be the closest — if you use a walker or have trouble with steps or an uneven patio, you're better off exiting through the main sanctuary doors and not through the chapel.

Did you know that an average of 25 home fires started by candles are reported every day in the US? It's important to keep lit candles at least a foot away from anything that might catch on fire, to keep wicks trimmed short, and to never leave a burning candle unattended. Alternatively, there are options for flameless LED candles or electric wax melters that can make a room smell like a scented candle is burning. If you're committed to your real candles, make sure that you keep them on a sturdy and heat-resistant surface or stand, and away from drafts, paper, children, and pets (ESPECIALLY cats named Gingersnap who are completely entranced by fire).


NEW Church Mouse Newsletter schedule

Medical Moment: On Saturday June 23, I will be teaching a FREE group class at the IHA office in Milan. The class will be held from 10 am to 11 am, and a continental breakfast will be provided.

This class will focus on Advanced Care planning, naming an advocate, considerations for the last phase of our lives and the type of Medical Care you would or would not want to receive.

Some topics we will discuss include selecting your advocate (someone who will speak for you if you are not able to speak for yourself), palliative care, hospice care, and considerations for planning a funeral. Open discussion is encouraged. This class gives you an opportunity to ask questions you may have about end-of-life plans.

You will be able to complete your Advanced Care planning document the same day of the class because the other class participants can provide witness signatures for your document if you feel comfortable finalizing your document the same day.














SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

<u>Pastor</u> Since our last Session meeting, we are halfway through our New Members class (which has thus far included the miraculous feat of getting through 2,000 years of church history in one hour). I have bought new pamphlets to update the narthex info racks, found ways to incorporate tea into Bible study and the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles into a sermon, and we are halfway through our current Bible study book ("Wearing God" by Lauren Winner). In the next month, I am looking forward to what should be a very memorable Pentecost service, starting a summer Bible study series on Revelation, and hosting a concert in our sanctuary on May 24. Gingersnap is still wearing her white collar with spring flowers for the season of Easter, but is looking forward to putting on a red Wonder Woman collar for Pentecost.

<u>Cancer Hats</u> Currently for 2018, 108 soft hats have been knit and delivered to St. Joe's Oncology Unit, and four have been sent to a cancer patient in Missouri = 112 hats delivered.

<u>Church Computer</u> Session approved the purchase of a Church Windows payroll module, for a one-time purchase cost of \$379, plus an annual \$69 charge to cover support.

<u>Buildings and Grounds</u> New flush valves for the five church toilets were purchased and installed. A Manse basement storage door was repaired.



<u>Christian Education</u> On Sunday May 13, we celebrated Mother's Day, and the women of the congregation received a flower after the worship service. Graduation and Youth Sunday will be held on June 10. A Graduation breakfast will be held at 8:30 that morning in the Fellowship Hall honoring our graduate, Amanda Clarke. Vacation Bible School is scheduled for kick off on Sunday, July 8, and wrap up is on Sunday July 15. We are still in need of teachers - please contact Carole London or Lisa Pratt if you are interested in helping.

<u>Membership</u> The Membership Committee is putting together a new member packet of information for those who will be completing the new member class.

<u>Mission and Outreach</u> \$1,075 was collected for One Great Hour of Sharing. The Pentecost Offering is currently being collected.

Worship and Music Notes from Worship and Music Meeting May 8: Pastor Leia shared exciting plans for Pentecost Sunday on May 20, and ideas for decorating the sanctuary on that day were discussed. Tickets are available for the Bobby Jo Valentine Concert to be held on Thursday, May 24 in our Sanctuary. Posters will be distributed in various places in downtown Milan, and information about the concert is being shared with area churches. Gluten-free wafers are now available for Communion. New/different versions of the Gloria Patri, Doxology, and Lord's Prayer are being explored.



History – we do make progress In working to clean up old Building Committee files, the Clerk found several "wish list" pages from the early 1980s. These show how many of these "hopes for the future" have actually been accomplished, such as paving the parking lot, new carpet in the sanctuary including under the pews (originally the floor under the pews was vinyl tiles), air conditioning, and stained glass windows. Many changes and improvements have been made since the sanctuary was first built.

The group continues to meet on the <u>third Thursday afternoon of each month</u>, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the church Lounge, to visit while we work. Hats are gathered and a delivery is made to St. Joe.
