Riverside Community Meals

Did you know that each month, we have volunteers who bake/donate dessert and serve meals to the homeless at First Presbyterian in Ypsilanti?

If you prefer not to bake/donate dessert, you can still volunteer to come and serve food to the homeless. Or, if you prefer to only bake/donate dessert, but not attend, you can do that too!

Mission needs your help. We are still very involved in taking desserts on the fourth Wednesday of each month to First Presbyterian Church of Ypsilanti for their Riverside Community Meal program. The Riverside Church is part of the Ypsilanti Hunger Coalition: an association of local churches including First United Methodist, Holy Trinity, First Presbyterian, and St. Matthew's United Methodist, who for several decades have prepared and served free meals for those in need in the Ypsilanti area. The meals typically feed 60 – 80 people, sometimes more, on a weekly basis.

Peoples Presbyterian Church provides a dessert once a month for 60 - 80 people. It can be **any dessert** —in the past we have brought sheet cake, cupcakes, cookies, and brownies.

You do not have to feel obligated stay for the meal to help serve; you can drop off a dessert or contact anyone on the Mission Committee to deliver your dessert. There is a sign-up sheet in Fellowship Hall. Please consider helping out! If you have any questions, please contact Chad Lawver.

A huge thank you to the congregation for the Pentecost Offering. We raised a total of \$530. A \$200 donation was made to Milan High Schools' Lifesavers (anti-depression and suicide) and Peer Mediation (Healthy conflict resolution and positive relationships) Programs!

Planning is also underway for my installation service, September 2 following worship. Gingersnap is currently wearing a rainbow collar for Pride Month.

New Members Six new members were approved on June 20, 2018: Boston Bashaw, Brooklyn Bashaw, Amanda Clarke, Sara Fital, Patti Fitzpatrick, and Alex Vollink-Frand. They will come before the congregation on Sunday, June 24, 2018. With these additions, the church now has 116 Active Members, and most continue a tradition of family membership at PPC.

PPC Women's Group The Cancer Hats group continues to meet monthly to create hats for cancer patients who have lost their hair. To date for 2018, 140 knit hats have been delivered to St. Joe's Oncology Unit, and four have been sent to a cancer patient in Missouri = 144.

We are gearing up for Vacation Bible School where we will be "Shipwrecked" for the week. We will be doing t-shirts for all the kids and volunteers. The fire department will come on Friday evening after our closing potluck to spray the kids with fire hoses. After VBS we will be working on Bible lessons during Sunday School.

Membership Membership continues to work with Nancy S. on the finishing details for the new Pictorial Church Directory.


Mission and Outreach The \$1,070 collected for One Great Hour of Sharing has been sent in. The Pentecost Offering brought in \$530; \$212 (40%) will be given to Peer Mediation and Life Savers at Milan High School, and \$318 will be sent to PCUSA. A Christmas in July Collection, organized by the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church congregation, has invited local congregations to participate. Sue Barney is organizing the PPC effort.

Worship and Music Discussion of future Worship Services revolving around members' favorite Bible stories and favorite hymns. Positive comments were made regarding Pentecost Sunday, with members taking part in the service in various languages, releasing of balloons and doves. 
